# **SUMMARY**

Virginia Gay Hospital (VGH) In conjunction with Benton County Public Health (BCPH), has a commitment to establishing and maintaining effective partnerships throughout the county and works with all entities that influence community health. The Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) 2022-2025 is a dedicated plan to improve and strengthen the local planning process by working with multiple community partners involved in the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) process.

The Community Health Need Assessment (CHNA) done in 2022 identified these three health priorities:

- Mental Health
- Substance Abuse
- Health Prevention

Collaborative work groups are formed, with multiple community partners. To ensure progress on the CHIP, community partners select objectives based on these priorities and identified strategies to achieve these objectives individually and collaboratively. VGH collaborates with different members of our community and has multiple community partnerships involved in the CHNA and CHIP processes.

Local health departments in lowa are required by state statutes to systematically collect data and make it available to the public as a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA). CHNA was last released in December 2019. It is also required to create and enact a CHIP to address the health priorities affecting their community by engaging the public and community partners. The CHNA collects data, while the CHIP works to address the health disparities identified in the CHNA.

CHIP is a living document that is reviewed and revised annually to review current goals and objectives and document progress. This is a tool to provide opportunities for health where the people of Benton County live, learn, work, and play.

# BENTON COUNTY DEMOGRAPHICS

#### Service Area


The community VGH serves, as defined for the CHNA, is based on the primary service area of our hospital. The major service area is Benton County, with an area of 716.27 square miles. VGH also services several other counties and states. Per the lowa Hospital Association Dimensions Program (2022) 82.70% of the 22,340 outpatient visits were from residents of Benton County. Benton County population is estimated at 26,000.

According to the most recent data available from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the death rate for the entire U.S. population increased by 5.3% from 835.4 deaths per 100,000 population in 2020 to 879.7 in 2021. As a result, life expectancy at birth for the U.S. population decreased from 77 years in 2020 to 76.4 years in 2021.

Affordable, high-quality health care is essential to improving our health. But where we live can have an even greater impact. Improving health and longevity in communities starts with ensuring access to healthy food, good schools, affordable housing, and jobs that provide us with the resources necessary to care for ourselves and our families. In essence, the types of conditions that can help keep us from getting sick in the first place.

Benton County, IA borders Black Hawk County, IA, Buchanan County, IA, Iowa County, IA, Johnson County, IA, Linn County, IA, Poweshiek County, IA, and Tama County, IA.

Benton County is the 25th largest county in Iowa. The Benton County estimated population is 25,705 with a growth rate of 0.08% in the past year according to the most recent United States census data.



### **PRIORITY 1**

#### **Mental Health**

Per the World Health Organization "Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity." Mental health includes a person's emotional, psychological, and social well-being. It is important at every stage of life, from childhood and adolescence through adulthood. A mental illness is a condition that affects a person's thinking, feeling or mood. Genetics, environment, and lifestyle influence whether someone develops a mental health condition.

#### Mental Health

- Goal 1: Reduce intentional injuries among Benton County residents; reduce the percentage of Benton County students who have in the past 12 months seriously considered suicide by 1%.
  Actions Completed:
  - 9/2022 VGH Employee Self Awareness presentation; Leading with Grit, Gratitude and Grace
  - VGH/ Flash motorsports display on Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Awareness Month.
  - 9/2023 VGH Employee Suicide prevention and Employee Assistance Education
  - Benton County Suicide Prevention Coalition established in May 2023, ongoing.
  - Out of the Darkness Walk September 2023, 120 participants.
  - Benton County Open House was held in August 2023 to provide information, resources, and support in relation to suicide prevention.
  - An Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training was held in Benton County, ten people attended.
  - Youth Mental Health First Aid Training July 2023. Five people attended.
  - The 4-H Mindful Teen: From Surviving to THRIVING program is a statewide partnership with county 4-H
    programs. The goal of the program is to establish long-term self-care and mindfulness practices that
    help young people navigate daily experiences and plan for the future. 2022 Benton County 4-H
    partnership with Vinton-Shellsburg High School.
  - 2023 Mental Health First Aid training for two staff at Vinton Public Library. QPR for professionals that work with youth (suicide prevention training) one staff completed.
  - Vinton Public Library Received a \$10,000 grant from the American Library Association for providing library services to patrons with intellectual disabilities.
  - Abbe Center for Community Health Services ongoing
- Goal 2: Increase mental health services for Benton County residents.

- Rural Access Center Program: "Zen Den," assessment and screening for brain health, physical health conditions, suicide risk, brain injury and substance abuse.
- Foundation 2 Crisis Services/ Benton County Sheriff's Office: Crisis intervention and follow up, FY22, 182 contacts. FY23, 354 contacts.

## **PRIORITY 2**

#### **Substance Abuse**

Substance abuse can have a major impact on individuals, families, and communities. The effects of substance abuse tend to be cumulative, significantly contributing to costly social, physical, mental, and public health problems. Substance abuse refers to a set of related conditions with the consumption of mind- and behavioraltering substances that have negative behavioral and health outcomes.

#### **Substance Abuse**

Goal 1: Decrease substance abuse among Benton County Youth. Decrease the percentage of 11<sup>th</sup> graders who reported it was "easy/very easy" to have access to alcohol by 3%.

#### Actions:

- Above the Influence Core Measurement Survey-Benton County Data collection
- VGH ongoing partnership with Above the Influence Coalition
- Iowa Youth Survey Data review
- Continued promotion for Quitline and MyLifeMyQuit for tobacco cessation programs, MyLifeMyQuit is designed specifically for youth.
- Community event: National Night Out August 2023: "Hidden in Plain Sight" trailer,
- Community event: Garrison Fun Day October 2023 "Hidden in Plain Sight" trailer.
- Public Health and Community Opioid Task Force Est 2023. 2024 VGH proposals submitted.
- Training on Narcan, Current drug trends and Trauma Informed Care provided by ASAC to Van Horne EMS, Access Hub, Foster parents at Four Oaks, Benton Community Schools, and patients in treatment.
- ASAC has worked with Benton Community Schools to train how to use Narcan, assisted with Narcan
  policy and provided them with appropriate paperwork to get Narcan delivered to them.

- ASAC has provided one hundred businesses and reached over 150 people providing them with education on substance abuse. Education provided on vaping/tobacco education to patients in treatment.
- ASAC: TIPS (Training for Intervention Procedures) training for those who hold a class C liquor license.
   There were twelve people total who were trained. This training helps servers learn skills for responsible beverage serving.
- ASAC: provided education to four different classes at Vinton Shellsburg High School approx. one hundred students. The education was on drug trends and vaping/tobacco.
- ISTEP (Iowa Students for Tobacco Education Prevention) group at Vinton Shellsburg High School. This group is led by students who want to step up and take action against tobacco and mental health.
- LifeSkills to Vinton Shellsburg High School Freshman Health Class. This class has twenty-three students. LifeSkills is designed to promote positive health and personal development.
- Rural Access center: Coordination of health services. Average of fifteen client referrals/engagements
  each month and to maintain a follow up schedule of 1 week, 1 month, 6 month and yearly wellness
  checks. Ongoing
- Goal 2: Decrease prescription drug abuse among Benton County residents; increase the number of pounds of prescription medications collected through drop boxes by fifty pounds.

#### Actions:

- Posters/fliers distributed to health care locations throughout the county, including medical clinics and pharmacies. Take Back Days for prescription medications. October 2023
- Promotion provided by VGH, Benton County Above the Influence Coalition, and ASAC.
- Provide information to the community on Count, Lock-Up, Dispose campaign through various forms of media and sustainable locations. Example: Benton County Health Fair, Community events. 2022/2023
- Promote Take Back Days for prescription medications. Take Back Days for prescription medications.

# **PRIORITY 3**

#### Preventive health

Preventive health consists of measures taken for disease prevention by use of proactive health screenings, counseling, and maintenance to prevent future illness. Examples of preventative care are blood pressure, diabetes, and cholesterol testing. Cancer screenings, including mammograms and colonoscopies. Education and counseling and regular well-baby and well-child visits. Preventive measures can be taken at all stages of life to improve our well-being and decrease the burden of disease.

#### **Preventive Health**

- Goal 1: Promote current Health programs and provide education to residents of Benton County Actions:
  - Community events held to provide information, resources, and support in relation to preventive health.
  - Promotion of current VGH services; Diabetes program, Gifts of Hope, PT, Yoga, Childcare, Health Fair, Financial navigator/SHIIP, 3D Mammograms and Party in Pink. Pink Basketball game, promoting mammographic services 2022/2023/2024.
  - Benton County Fair booth 2022/2023/2024 VGH/PH provided information on current Health programs and provided education. Blood pressure checks provided.
  - VGH/PH Blood Pressure clinics at Vinton HACAP resumed November 2022 BP's taken and education provided. 2023 total:131 2024 total:231.
  - Continued discussion with the City and Vinton Park and Recreation Department, have been working on
    plans for a new Wellness Center that would be located adjacent to the high school and combine
    indoor/outdoor pool areas, gym, walking track, meeting rooms and exercise. This is a partnership that
    will benefit the community as well as allow Virginia Gay to provide services: diabetes prevention/weight
    loss/cooking demos/ CPR-first Aide/Baby-sitting/ Coordination support groups/Mental Health peer
    support/ Grieving/Ministerial services.
  - Environmental Health: Completed water samples for bacteria and nitrate forty-three in Benton County 2023
  - Environmental Health: Completed 47 Animal bite investigations and follow up.
  - Environmental Health attended the Iowa Conference and Water Well Conference.
  - Continued monthly COVID 19 Vaccine Clinics coordination/scheduling. in Benton County 58.6% fully vaccinated Dec 2022, Vaccine Clinics discontinued June 2023.
  - Continued services to provide vaccines that prevent diseases for children. (Immunizations): VGH
    Hospital and Clinics/ UP serve as VFC providers.
  - VGH Certified Dementia Friendly Facility. Training completed 10/2022.
  - HACAP: Provided screening, fluoride varnish, oral health instruction and sealants to Tilford, Longfellow and Shellsburg Elementary Schools
  - HACAP became the WIC Contractor on October 1, 2022, and currently provides WIC clinics twice per month in Benton County; it will be increasing to three times per month within the next 3-4 months.
  - HACAP: The 1st Five program has seven participating medical practices in Benton County; during FY 2023, has received referrals for children with suspected delays/family stress from three of them.
  - HACAP's Childcare Nurse Consultant has provided twelve on-site visits and 105 technical assistance contacts to fifteen early childhood programs in Benton County
- ❖ Goal 2: Increase Health prevention services to the residents of Benton County Actions:

Community events held to provide information, resources, and support in relation to preventive health.

- VGH/PH provided Community education in November 2022. Invited by the Vinton Kiwanis Club at Pizza
  Ranch and open to the community. The education provided was on the "Tripledemic". Education and
  updates provided on Flu, RSV and COVID-19 and what we can do to protect ourselves and others.
- VGH/PH: March 2023 Pink Stiletto event Belle Plaine: Education provided on Preventative Care and Health Maintenance for Women, including Benton County health system resources. Reviewed available screenings and recommendations for ages 20s-90's and provided "Taking Steps for a Healthier you" checklist based on age to individual attendees. Blood pressure screenings were performed on attendees and exhibitors. Approximately sixty-five were in attendance.
- 4/1/23 Health Fair: Approximately 250 in attendance including attendees and exhibitors. Networking with
  forty-seven unique Health and Wellness Community Resources. Public Health hosted and provided
  /education and resources on; Preventative care and Blood pressure screenings, COVID19 information
  and free at home test kits, Emergency Preparedness information and free disaster home kits, Hand
  Hygiene education along with hands on exercise with Glitterbug program and Reach out and Read
  program with free book distribution.
- HACAP partnership for Feeding America implementation with VGH and Clinics which began in October 2022. VGH/PH has helped strengthen, support, and mobilize communities and partnerships to improve health through this program providing food boxes with appropriate food pantry resources or referrals for assistance to those with food insecurity. Phase II implementation November 2023.
- VGH Flu Clinics: VGH/PH Flu Clinics 2022 approx. eighty vaccines given. 2023: 80, 2024 66.
- VGH: SHIIP partnership 8/2022 implementation. SHIIP clinic approx. three hundred Benton County residents served in 2022. SHIIP informational seminar 4/2023. VGH Health Fair Booth 2023,2024.
   Client Contacts Breakdown Mercy Medical Center Linn County: 910 client contacts, Virginia Gay Hospital (VGH): 622 client contacts. 6/2024 Total: 1,532 client contacts (This number increases by the day)

- VGH: 3/2023 Girl Scout Garden User Agreement produce was donated to Atkins food program for distribution in community. 2024: The Atkins Girl Scout Community Garden flourished over the summer, with dedicated Scouts working hard to grow fresh vegetables and flowers for the community.
- VGH/Benton County to provide Jail nursing 3/2023 10/2024.
- VGH: Iowa Cancer Consortium Grant Sun Safety Program provided sunscreen accessibility at outdoor public events. 2022/2023/2024
- VGH Medical Clinics: Reach Out and Read Program promoting literacy in the community. Youth from birth to age 5 receive a book at child wellness visits. Providers read with the children, helping to assess development progress and encourage families to read at home. By age 5 children will have built up a home library of fifteen books.
- Benton County Transportation: Providing reliable transportation to the citizens of Benton County. FY 22-23 we provided 18,657 rides for Benton County residents and traveled 217,114 miles. Providing transportation to medical visits, pharmacies, grocery stores, day habs, shopping venues, etc.
   Partnership with HACAP to deliver hot meals at lunch in both Vinton and Belle Plaine. Now providing transport to VA in lowa City to transport disabled Vets to medical appointments.
- FY23 Benton County Child Care Nurse Consultant Hawkeye Area Community Action Program
   (HACAP): Child Care Nurse Consultant (CCNC) services to Early Learning Environments serving
   children age six weeks to six years in Benton performed 20 Consultation visits to early childhood
   programs, 19 Children with special health care needs served, 15 Early Childhood programs served.
- FY23 Benton County Head Start Hawkeye Area Community Action Program (HACAP): Head Start serves 3-5-year-old children. Services will be offered to Benton County families five days a week, ten hours a day for up to two hundred days. 24 Children enrolled in Head Start, 17% of Children were screened for developmental delays and referred for follow up services/treatment.
- Literacy Initiatives: Our bookshelf from ISU extension. Provided weekly virtual classes teaching a
  reading technique called dialogic reading, and prereading skills in children aged three to six. The Dolly
  Parton Imagination Library mails an age-appropriate book to enrolled children each month, free of
  charge. The program also provides pre- and early literacy tips. 384 Families served Our Bookshelf. 446
  Families served Dolly Parton Imagination Library
- Better Tomorrows: Over fifty childcare professionals completed the Early Childhood Positive Behavioral Supports and Interventions training. 19 childcare programs utilized our behavioral support program which provided over 120 onsite consultations and technical assistance contacts. Forty-one childcare professionals completed professional development classes related to early childhood behavior and positively managing behaviors in the classroom.
- Better Tomorrows: Recent data for early literacy screening has 66% of kindergarten students in Benton
  County and 58% in Tama County meeting the fall benchmark. To help address this need, we have
  introduced a variety of early literacy initiatives serving 500 children, resulting in: 100% of families report
  an increase in reading to their child each day, 77% of families report an increase in talking with their
  child about new words,100% of families that reported increasing the amount of time they talk, sing, and
  play with their child.

• March 2024: VGH Health Fair was a great success, drawing approximately 470 attendees and featuring around 60 exhibitors offering a variety of health and wellness activities. Participants enjoyed services and information from Virginia Gay Hospital which included, Food & Nutrition Services, Therapy, Respiratory Therapy, Human Resources, Home Health, and Foundation. Other exhibitors included SHIIP, HACAP, the Lions Club (offering free eye screenings), the Vinton Public Library, Benton and Linn County Public Health, EMS services, and the Benton County Sheriff's Department, which provided child ID cards. Additional highlights included hands-on arts and crafts, resources from the Riverview Center, local educational institutions, Farm to School and Farm to Table initiatives, lowa State Extension Services, and many more. Volunteers conducted 35 blood pressure checks, and 45 food boxes were distributed to community members.

### **NEXT STEPS**

### **Health Improvement Plan Continues**

The CHNA was adopted by the Virginia Gay Hospital Board of Directors on September 27, 2022. Virginia Gay Hospital and other community stakeholders are encouraged to use this CHNA to plan strategies and establish objectives based on the identified health priorities. As listed, Benton County is fortunate to have many collaborative partnerships to serve the needs of our community.

The CHIP 2022-2025 is a living document that will be reviewed and revised annually. Our community is constantly evolving, and we want to ensure that our work reflects the health needs of our community. Updates will be provided to the community throughout the implementation of CHIP. The Community Health Assessment and Improvement Plans are a cyclical process. In 2024, data collection will begin for the next CHNA, while the CHIP work continues with community partners.

Benton County Public Health is available to the community to help facilitate activities associated with the CHNA, coordinate community response efforts, and support the needs of agencies for data collection and analysis.
